Being a nine-yearold kid, she first went through sexual harassment by one of her coach at the institutional care, but she did not dare to speak about it, and neither she had the strength to protect herself from that beast. She said, "The day when he unzipped his pants behind the fuel store and showed me his muscle, I knew I'd arrived at a new, terrible place..." (Down, Bodies of Light, 150). In the past she has also hacked sexual harassment and assault from a demon who was her father's friend. Throughout her life, she has searched for friendship, love and care, but instead, she gets humiliation, loneliness and abuse. Her terrific experiences have never left her alone and for a minute and that constant battle with herself; with her soul eventually let her quit her studies at university level. It is not that she never fell in love or tried to stay in a healthy relationship, but destiny never gave her the opportunity to be loved or happy as she manifested. However, life continues at its own pace and finds a way to meet the ultimate goal. Likewise, Maggie has also found her life partner, and her ultimate goal is to be a wife and disassociate herself from all the horrendous past experiences that are heartbreaking from all the aspects of a healthy and peaceful life.

#### 2. VULNERABILITY AND CONTEXT

Vulnerability, abuse, and trauma are part of the life of Maggie Sullivan, and in the book "Bodies of Light" Jenifer Down has shown the real picture of life to a large extent and has portrayed the real face of the world. The psychological battle that Maggie Sullivan has carried out through her childhood and adolescence is a naked truth of society. The novel can be read in the context of global evaluation into the institutional sexual harassment, abuse of children or psychological context of a young girl that has gone through rape, threats,



and harassment (Midalia, 2021). Being an orphan young girl Maggie has been raped by different men and was abused sexually, and that impacted her psychologically and gave an idea about the world that 'Men are the authority of the world'. As she grows up, gradually, she realizes that she has survived in such a world that has no mercy, or empathy and has led her life by cutting all ties with her past in order to stay happy and joyful. Her novel "Body of Light" is one of the most impactful stories that shows all the sides of the real world. The story portrays the pain of a sexually abused child, her fear of a series of failed and broken relationships, the impact of drug addiction and so on. On the other hand, this also portrays the story of survival, resilience, human kindness and the importance of hope and self-belief and willingness. The story thus empathized with the feminist saga and popularised feminism in the 1960s and 1970s, and that impacted the misogynistic authority to a great extent. The story starts with the disturbing childhood of Maggie Sullivan, and in the chapter, her pain and fear are drowned in such a way that readers can immediately establish a connection with the character. However, life doesn't go according to plan, and somewhere, her willingness helps her to survive after all the backlashes. The character has all the shades and there is a will to survive the horrific trauma and on the other hand darkness, depression, and anxiety from her past experience. Maggie has been there throughout her life to find real love, support and respect. Throughout her life she has experienced abuse, rape, betrayal from her surrounding male individuals. By the age of 9 Maggie had learned to keep secret of all her pain and she had the constant fear that in case she shared her experience that might lead her to more danger. Maggie has undergone mixed feelings and complex psychology in the case of her relationships and made wrong choices and ended up being lonely, broken and devastated. From their life experiences, Maggie has realized that the reaction of an individual is the reflection of their earlier experience, and it is ok to do. The abuses and mental trauma had impacted Maggie from the core of her soul, and she was not able to concentrate on her studies. She constantly felt that she did not have the same social facilities as her peers. However, this time life had other plans for her as three of her children died one after another and their relationship had come to an end. This time period was one of the most devastating and depressing for Maggie as she could feel that her connection with her husband was going to be in vain (Sydney Reviews of Books, 2021). During her third pregnancy and the death of her second son Maggie felt less emotional connection with Damien and that eventually ended in a while. The story not only describes Maggie's psychology, her struggle but at the same time also portrays a twist and turn for her life. After breaking up with Damien Maggie moves out to another nation and falls in love with a woman. That eventually states another chapter of her life, and she changes her name here to Josie, which signifies her willingness to live and gain happiness in life that she had never experienced for a longer period of time (Sydney Reviews of Books, 2021). Maggie falls in love with a woman named Tamaryan, who portrays that after being broken by men, she wants to be loved by a woman as for her men gives pain, trauma and violence. However, that relationship didn't go well, and she realized that love was enough. It requires trust, and Josie, as in Maggie, was not able to reach that part. Maggie said, "There was so much that I never told Jeff" (Down, Bodies of Light, 289). The entire story describes the ups and downs of life along with the psychological battle of a human being. It is evident that 'Bodies of Life' is a book that teaches its audience empathy, the power of willingness and

the pace of life. By looking into the context of the book, it can be stated that the statement "When life gives you a lemon, make lemonade out of it" is so relevant to the life story of Maggie Sullivan (Midalia, 2021). The woman has faced several setbacks despite always finding a way to survive and moreover she has "love" a chance every time. However she failed most of the time but never stopped believing in love. Moreover the story is inspiring for many women around the world and teaches all the sexually harassed, abused and abandoned women that even if life is not going as planned, never stop hoping for that happy day.

# **3. NOT HAVING A VOICE AS KID**

As the stories start, readers can see that Maggie is talking to someone who knows her past and is talking about some past memories, and then from that, the readers can see the switch back to the past, which is in 1975 Australia. It can be seen that Maggie has a vulnerable past and a disturbed childhood and that eventually impacted her entire life to a great extent (Midalia, 2021). Young age Maggie Sullivan lost her mother and was initially growing up with her dad who was a drug addict. Whenever Maggie talks about her past, memories related to her father have always put him at rest as a loving man who was addicted to drugs and was not able to take care of her. Within these phrases the readers can see the option down of Maggie's life at that young age. Maggie, who was just a kid, was not able to understand what was going on with her and what was the meaning of it but she could feel that she was weak and she had no place to go. She needs something to hold tightly. At the age of 5 her drug addict father went to jail and the first ever turn off Maggie's life began from that. As her father went into jail, Maggie eventually became an orphan and was placed in state care. Maggie's traumatic life started at the age of 5 when she was sexually assaulted by one of her friends. She is a child who is fragile, scared, and doesn't have the words to describe what is going on with her -she is quite silent. Being a kid, she doesn't have the capacity to describe what she feels. Child actions can only describe that "it hurt to pee afterward and that she had 'fingertip-sized' bruises on her thigh that 'yellowed and eventually disappeared" (Down, Bodies of Light, 314). During her childhood she



has been moved often to brutal residential homes and till the time of adulations she has the desire for true friendship but she has only received pain. During the time of the institutional case, Maggie has also been sexually tortured by her coach (Sydney Reviews of Books. 2021). Maggie was so scared to express her feelings to the authorities or even to her classmates as the person who was abusing her had a great connection with authority, and that gave the monster the opportunity to prey on young girls who don't have a support system to ask for help. Being a little kid Maggie was devastated and she had no place to go; she didn't have the strength to share her feelings and to tell people what was happening with her. Judith was a sensible, composed woman, and she provided Maggie with the best child care that she had ever expressed before. Being abandoned, Maggie has been brought up in "state care," and since her childhood, she has faced humiliation and sexual abuse from her surrounding environment. Despite all the love and care that Maggie's foster parent has given her, she fell in love with an older man who had eventually dumped her, and that disappointed her parent very much. Maggie realizes her feelings for Ned during the time of their physical relationship, but she was trying to hold him to be loved the way she loved him but didn't get that love. She described her feelings at the time of her physical relationship with Ned "Sometimes he was so rhythmic, grunting and heaving against me, that when I sneaked a look at his face, I got a flash of something primal but also pathetic, like watching a dog humping something's leg" (Down, Bodies of light, 402).During the time of Maggie's heartbreak, Judith supported her throughout the period and said that "she can be more than she is, "and Maggie trusted her (Sydney Reviews of Books. 2021). When Maggie recalls that phase she just wished that Ned could have treated her a bit more sensibly, and kindly. Maggie was in love with Ned, and she was passionate; Maggie said, "In those few seconds, I would have been happy for him to do anything with me, to make all my decisions for the rest of my life"(Down, Bodies of Light, 368). At that point, she also released the most important life lesson that that guy was not a demon or a monster- he did what he had learned from the ruthless world. It is true that every human action and reaction is a reflection of someone's actions or past expertise. Childhood trauma, a breakup with a man who is just double in age have affected her mind, and as a consequence, she was not able to pay attention to her studies. Another chapter of her love life begins the period- when Maggie was at Melbourne University(Sydney Reviews of Books. 2021). During her university days, she was not able to connect with others socially and her mind was allowing her to concentrate on her studies. One fine day she dropped out of college and at that period she met Damien and later on she got married to him. When Maggie was an adult, she made a bad choice by falling in love with a person who was double her age, and even after getting married to the love of her life, Maggie was not able to enjoy life. In each phase of her life such as being a kid as an adult and being a mother has dealt with anxiety, uncertainty and mental conflict. The time when she lost her kids was one of the hardest times for Maggie. Being a mother, it becomes difficult and heartbreaking to see the death of the child, and among all the challenges that Maggie has faced, this is definitely one of the greatest. At the time when Maggie lost her second baby and was pregnant for the third time within that period, she felt a less emotional connection with her husband. She lost her babies and her lover from her life despite all the willpower and courage that Maggie had in the relationship and motherhood. This story is full of characters and the readers can see various characters in the story, of course, the main character is Maggie and just like all the characters of the story she also has many shades. Within the time of her third pregnancy and grieving the loss of her second baby, Maggie felt that her relationship with her husband had come to an end

as she felt a less emotional and physical connection with him. One night, Maggie notices some sparkling bioluminescent lights on the water and calls Damien to enjoy the scenic beauty together. Maggie said, "I thought about how algae come to make its own light" (Down, Bodies of Light, 420). That night, the couple saw some cozy time that they had not spent in a few months. The novel rolls and Maggie has shifted to New Zealand and another chapter, another life lesson begins for Maggie (Sydney Reviews of Books. 2021). After all the trauma and uncertainty in her life, she decided to change her identity and lead a new life by removing all the negativity from her past. This particular phase of Josie's life gives a beautiful message that only love is not enough and respect and trust are required to maintain a relationship. Josie loved her love but she is closed off due to the part experiences and Tamaryan was not able to get through. As a consequence, this relationship was not able to survive for a longer period of time. Coming into a relationship with a woman was a great move by Maggie or Josie as she was trying to find peace

from the relationship and this also showcases that she was fed up with the betrayal and abuse both mentally and physically that all the men of her life gave her (Midalia, 2021). After breaking up with her girlfriend, Josie again changed her residence and moved to America to again start a new life. During that time, she met a new guy, Jeff, who was kind-hearted and trying to fill in the blanks in the house's life. Josie did not hold her back this time and she decided to give Jeff the chance to fall in love again and marry him. Throughout her journey, Maggie never stopped fighting and tried all the ways to find her soul mate and life partner. By looking into the life of Maggie aka Josie it is noticed that despite all the backlashes and mental breakdowns she never stopped to find a way.
